On Saturday 19 November 2022 kiwi are returning to the wild on the hills of Mākara. On this significant occasion, The Capital Kiwi Project invites Mākara school students and whānau to join the community of people who have enabled this to happen in welcoming kiwi home.

The return of kiwi comes after four years' hard work with landowners, iwi and locals. After being welcomed by iwi and the Mākara community, the 13 kiwi will receive health checks and transmitters; handlers will then take the kiwi to be released into burrows in the mānuka on Terawhiti Station.

There will be a chance to see the kiwi being prepared for release. The release will be live-streamed to the school.

As part of building our connections with the iwi and being involved in this project, we (as a school community) would like to koha afternoon tea on the day. Rachel Kasa will be in contact with you about this shortly. If you are able, we would gratefully receive any support you are able to offer with regards to a plate of food and/or support with marshalling on the day. Please contact Louise, Rachel or Caro.
